A note follows on this page:

“Having rec^d a Letter from my
Sister this morning with regard to the 3 shares
in the L.C Bank I have decided to buy
my Sisters half Share”

The L.C.Bank must be Coutts & Co,London

This was presumably written by Lady Constable (now of Burton Constable, Yorks). The sister referred to must be Miss (Eliza) Chichester, who continues to appear as a beneficiary until May 1860 when her share is paid to Lady Constable. It is possible therefore that the note was written at a later date than Nov.1857
